SEASON IV, FROM THE CENTER: A 360° LOOK AT MORDANCE

Two World Premieres, Live Music and a Guest Artist from American Ballet Theatre Bring
Ballet Back to the Sheen Center

New York, March 2, 2016- MorDance, in its mission to create modern, relevant movement that maintains the integrity of classical ballet, returns to New York's newest performing arts center as its resident ballet company this spring with Season IV, From the Center. The first company to perform on the Sheen Center stage in 2014, MorDance returns to its black box theater April 21-24 to present *Propinquity* and *Apart from the Peripheral*, two world premieres and *The Shape of Voice*, a continuation of a work commissioned by the Columbia Ballet Collaborative in November, 2015.

Rooted in a classical ballet vocabulary but spoken in a contemporary dialect, the ensemble of seven will reconfigure the Bleecker street space to perform in the round, surrounded by audiences on four sides of the stage. In providing a unique experience and view of these works for each patron, an athleticism, musicality and employment of innovative ideas, music and line redefine the lens through which Artistic Director Morgan McEwen creates.

"As an artist I am constantly seeking ways to bring the audience into my work," explains Mordance Artistic Director, Morgan McEwen. "This season I am quite literally doing that by creating a body of work that will be viewed from all sides, from the center and in the round. The effort that goes into a project where the audience sits on every side of the dancer calls for a heightened level of attention to detail—there is no moment a dancer can turn their backs to sneak in an extra breath or work to make a one dimensional shape like we often do. It is challenging, wonderful and can be daunting."

Set to an original score, Apart from the Peripheral delves into the concepts and misconceptions of erosion. While the word typically encompasses the breakdown and decline of something, many of the earth's most beautiful geographical landscapes have been caused by erosion. This concept is celebrated in humans as well, for when we are broken down and our excess is stripped, we exist in a genuine and honest state who can relate most naturally to the world around us. Celebrated composer and classical guitarist Nilko Andreas has been commissioned to create and perform his original score along side a string trio for this new work.

Propinquity | World Premiere

Music: Evening Side by Four Tet Lighting Design: Benjamin Williams

Created in residency at the Silo at Kirkland Farm, **American Ballet Theatre** dancer Stephanie Williams joins MorDance in an exploration of nearness in place, time, order and relation. With proximity of these conditions, the work explores the consequences and effects of how these measures of connection can change the outcome of an event, connection or experience.

The Shape of Voice | Re-Staging

Music: Caroline Shaw's Partita for Eight Voices

Lighting Design: Benjamin Williams

Originally commissioned in November 2015for the Columbia Ballet Collaborative, this work, now in its completion, is inspired by the piece of music composed solely of voices. In hearing and connecting with the breath and sound, this work connects to a raw and earthy texture found when both voices and bodies intertwine to create song and movement.

Morgan McEwen, ballerina turned artistic director, launched MorDance in January of 2013. MorDance has been named the 2016 resident dance company of Manhattan's Sheen Center, where they will hold their spring season and series of various workshops and events throughout the year. This young company, with dancers from some of the world's most prestigious companies, has playfully leapt to the edge of the classical ballet world. MorDance explores the use of athleticism in its aim to modernize and innovate while honoring the grace and beauty of classical ballet. MorDance premiered at Manhattan Movement and Arts center on May 3rd, 2013. The company has been invited to perform at numerous festivals, including Dance at Socrates, Counterpointe Project, and Sounds of the City. In 2014, MorDance helped The Sheen Center open their doors by being the first company to perform in their brand new black box theater. The company has also been granted space residencies at The Silo at Kirkland Farm and Mana Contemporary. MorDance aims to broaden the base of support for the art form of ballet, foster a greater appreciation for ballet, and develop future audiences through live performances and programs that service schools, families, individuals, and community groups.
